

## 2001 Balchen/Post Awards

### Outstanding Achievement in Airport Snow and Ice Control

At the 35<sup>th</sup> Annual International Aviation Snow Symposium on April 25<sup>th</sup>, 2001, in Buffalo, New York, awards were presented to the “Snow Crews” of the airports in the Snow Belt for their dedicated efforts in maintaining their airports in safe and operational status during the 2000-2001 winter season.
